6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Restructuring of curriculum is done once in three years. The University appoints BOS (Board of Studies) members from each subject & conducts meeting every year. The members contact the teaching faculty of concerned subjects from every college & collects their opinion regarding syllabus. According to the needs of the present day knowledge the syllabus is framed.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

The college conducts an evaluation of the staff by students every semester. Based on the feedback of the students, the staff improves their methodology of imparting knowledge to the students. (Annexure enclosed)

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

The College has been maintaining the system of conducting two internal assessment tests and one Lab. Internal Test followed by Annual Examination conducted by Karnataka State Womens' University, Bijapur. Valuation work is done in the University Campus.

College has a well established Internet facility in the Library. Unique Library Software (Easy Lib) is being used for maintenance of Library, Data Entry (Books, Journals) Transaction (Issue, Return, Renewal etc.). The Library prescribes on-line Journals. Sufficient systems are there for data entry and transaction. Printers are there for generation of barcode labels. There are 15 systems for the benefit of the users to browse the E-resources.

The College has a well written policy on appointment of staff, training and development, compensation and handling grievances. A convenor with Three (3) Council Members nominated by the Management to look after the activities/ administration and to carry out various requirements of effective Human Resource Management in place.

Our College is a Government Aided Private College. Hence President, Secretary of our society along with a nominee appointed by the Government conducts recruitment process as and when there is a need for filling up vacancy in a very objective and transparent manner.

7. Innovations and Best Practices

7.1 Innovations introduced during this academic year which have created a positive impact on the functioning of the institution. Give details.

1. The Department meetings are regularly conducted and the HOD's are responsible for all the academic programmes in the Department. The HODs meeting take place once in a fortnight with the principal and other officials, where all issues relating to the Departments and College are discussed and decisions are taken.
2. The College council meets once every semester with an agenda relating to College Academic calendar, Training Programmes and Infrastructure development. Workshops are organized for the non-teaching staff in computer literacy. Spoken English, Interpersonal relationship and other soft skills are offered to the non-teaching.
3. Every year the students are given career guidance and a training programming is conducted by placement cell for their easy entry into service. They are taught analytical, communication skills, personality development etc. Campus interviews are arranged for the final year students by well known companies like Wipro, Mahindra Tech., L&T etc.
4. Students are encouraged to take up assignments and projects that are separately evaluated.
5. Regular health checkups are arranged for the students by Lady Doctor and once in six month Dental, Bone Density and Eye check up are alternatively arranged and thus students are benefitted.
6. Complaints & Grievances of the students are collected in a secret box and is looked after by the Principal, Students welfare officer.
7. Remedial crosses are conducted for the academically weak students. Students who have regularly gone through this course have shown considerable improvement in their academic performance.

1. The College has taken a serious effort to motivate students to come in large numbers for various special programmes like coaching classes for English, Remedial and Mentoring.
2. A review meeting is organized at the end of various college programmes to analyze and find out areas of improvement. It helps the college to organize the various events of the college with greater efficiency and effectiveness.
3. The Principal has met the staff who have got less than 70% in the staff evaluation by the students and counselled them.
